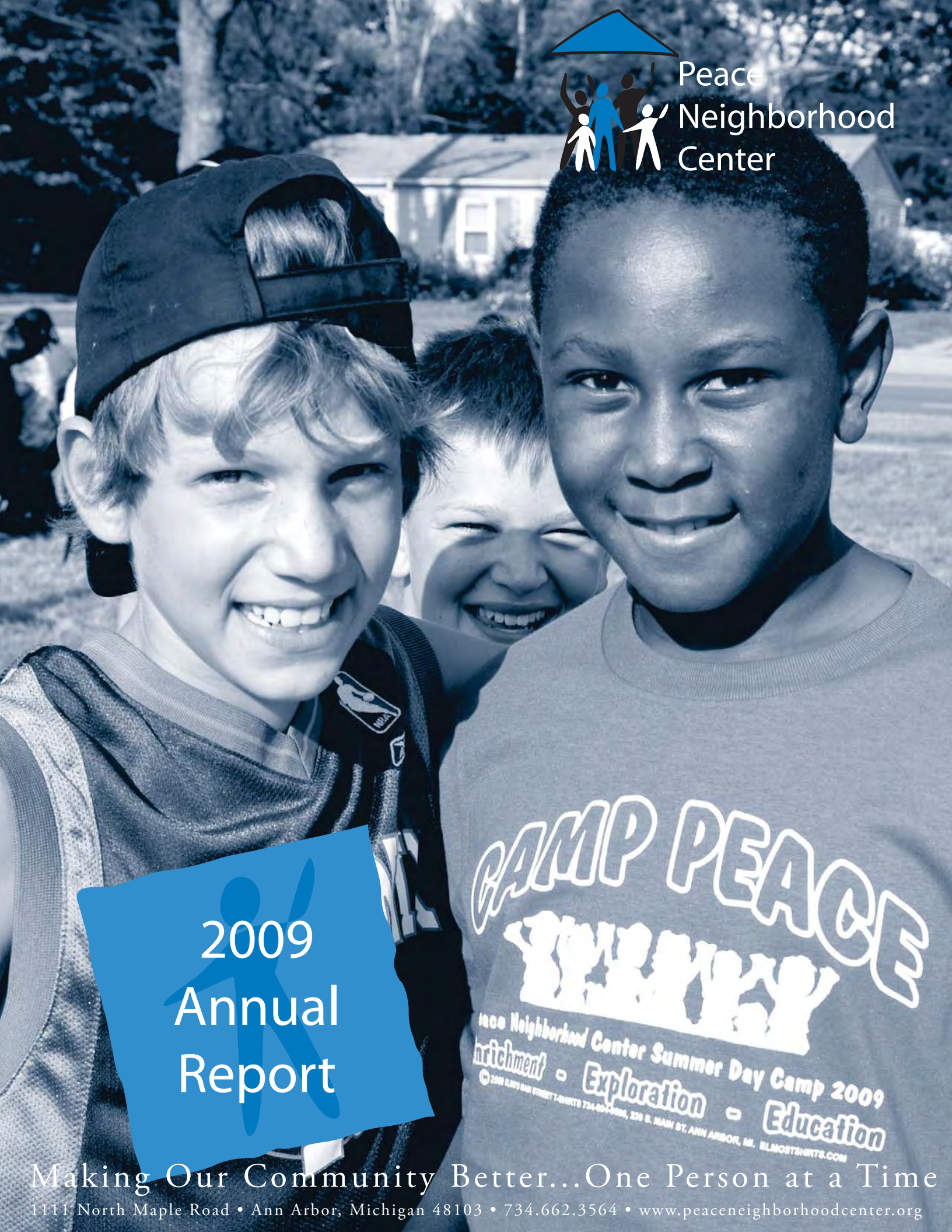

Many times this year I wish I could share with you all of the great things we as a family have accomplished. We try as much as possible to convey to you the wonderful progress we witness yearly through our newsletters, e-blasts and letters. However, the sheer amount of growth, sacrifice, strength and perseverance that we see in PNC family members makes it impossible to tell every tale behind every face. These individual stories provide inspiration for all of us involved in the daily operations of Peace. We are blessed to see it as it unfolds and we want to share that blessing with you as much as we can.



As you may know, in 1971 a group of neighbors met to put in place the foundation of Peace Neighborhood Center. That foundation has supported us on our evolving journey over the last four decades. During that time, Peace has been a catalyst for change in over 15,000 lives. Over the course of 2009, the vision started by that founding group continues to shine. Embraced and expanded by all of us, that vision assisted PNC family members to graduate from Michigan State, Eastern Michigan University and Washtenaw Community College. It helped open Peace House, our new program that will be fully occupied in 2010 as it provides supportive/transitional housing to two families. It helped to provide 18 teens and young adults with a summer job training program. It has helped mothers, fathers and children make life changing steps towards self-sufficiency. It has been the impetus of providing programs and services to over 1600 individuals this year. Most importantly, it has helped to make our community better one person at a time...

All of this may touch on the surface of what we helped do in 2009, but the full story lies somewhere between the lines. We never seem to have enough space to tell that whole story in a document such as this report, but, believe me, there is so much more that goes into helping 1600 individuals along their path to success. So this year let me remind you that you have an open invitation to come by and visit! Come by and speak with any PNC Staff to get the story between the lines. Come and be inspired! Come and be a part of what we call “managed chaos” – the smiles, the laughter, the struggles and all that goes with it. Drop by any weekday to hear and see some of the things between the lines. # Economics

The realities of the current economic situation were on the forefront of everyone's mind throughout 2009. Peace Neighborhood Center was no different, as we faced a difficult year of fundraising while dealing with a 200% increase in the number of Advocacy and Emergency Assistance calls we received over the number we received in 2008.

The need was great, and our resources limited. However, as we always have, Peace found a way to continue to offer hope to those in need. As the year progressed, Peace stood on the frontlines with the other agencies of Washtenaw County to keep people in their homes in the face of the worst economic downturn since the Great Depression, ultimately helping 247 households weather the storm.



2009 also saw the opening of Peace's latest initiative to help the families of Washtenaw County: the *Peace House* Transitional Housing Center. *Peace House* allows us to provide temporary housing for families as they work to get back on their feet. With the economy the way that it is, the timing could not have been better. We would like to thank everyone who helped make *Peace House* a reality!

# Education

One of the cornerstones of Peace's mission to break the cycle of poverty is its strong focus on education. Over its 38 year history, Peace Neighborhood Center has helped young people affected by lower economic and social standing to discover options and make choices that lead them to self-sufficiency as they transition into successful adult lives.



Peace's Youth Services include the REACH After School program for K-5th grade students and the Alternatives for Youth After School program for 6th-8th grade students. Performance Arts Academy, Rising Sons Mentorship for Boys, STARS Mentorship for Girls, Leadership Camp and the College/ Career Prep Club provide educational and emotional support to each child.



## Lee's Story

The smile on Lee's face seemed to be a mile wide as she told the PNC staff about her first days in clinical. Lee has been a member of the PNC family since she was 10 and is now in her program at EMU to become a RN, with a plan to specialize in Pediatric nursing. As a Team Leader in our Summer Day Camp this year, she supervised teens in our Job Training Program and gave back as a mentor to two 8th graders. Lee says, "Peace Center is my home! The place I know I am supported and loved! Without it I wouldn't be where I am today!"

# Energy

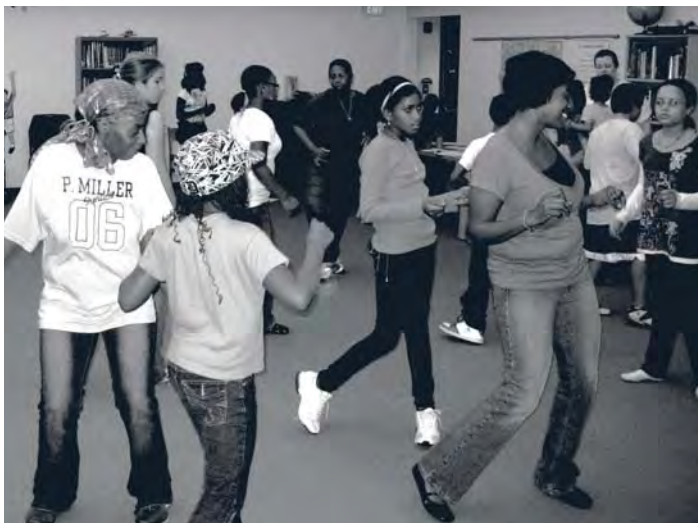


The Family Enrichment Program is a new, adult centered program designed to provide opportunities for personal education and growth through diverse programming. Programs include informational workshops that address issues such as financial planning and improving positive communication between home and school, dance classes, support groups for men and women going through recovery, cooking classes, and family field trips.

The one constant in Peace's history has been change as we have constantly worked to evolve our programs to meet the needs of those we serve. 2009 continued that rich tradition of change as we added the Family Enrichment program, expanded the focus of the College/Career Prep Club and opened the new Peace House Transitional Housing Center.



As we move into the future, Peace seeks to build on the energy we developed in 2009. From momentous occasions like opening a new building, to chatting with the Governor at a fundraiser we held with Zingerman's Deli, to small gestures by our great volunteers, Peace is proud of the successes and triumphs we accomplished over the last year.
